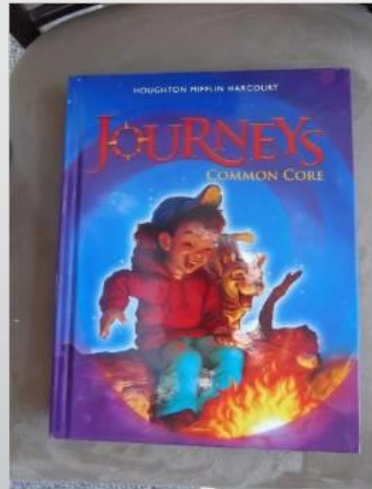
What Programs and Services are Being Offered Through Title 1?
